

Supply List
St. Thomas the Apostle - Grades Six, Seven, and Eight

ALL STUDENTS are asked to come to school **EACH DAY** with the following:

- AT LEAST 3 masks (cloth or disposable)
- A personal-sized bottle of hand sanitizer (to be kept at their desk)

We may be asking for additional supplies during the year, but for now supplies needed from home and the items needed daily are:

- 3 packs of 3x3 Post-It notes
- Black/blue ballpoint pens
- Red ballpoint pens
- 1 box of Sharpened pencils
- Hand held pencil sharpener
- Highlighters
- Colored pencils
- Small stapler
- Scotch Tape
- Scissors (with rounded tip)
- Glue stick
- 1 soft pencil case (large enough to fit items listed above)
- 6-inch protractor (for home use)
- 1 calculator with radical sign. This is to be used in both math and science classes.
- Student Planner
- Computer mouse (wired or wireless) *Be sure to label with the child's name.
- 2 boxes of tissues (for classroom use)
- 1 container of Clorox/Lysol wipes (if possible)
- 1 container of baby wipes
- 1 roll of paper towels

Please note that all textbooks must be covered with either book sox or brown paper. Workbooks are to be covered in clear contact paper.

Below is a list of items needed per subject.

Religion - all classes:

- One folder- labeled
- 1 pack of lined 4x6 index cards

Math – all classes:

- One spiral 3-subject notebook with pocket folders
- One graphing paper notebook
- Two folders (6th grade only)
- Basic calculator with a square root button (as listed above)

Language Arts (Gr. 7 & 8)

- Spiral 3-subject notebook
- One folder
- 1-inch flexible binder
- Gr. 7 purchase Skellig by David Almond
- Gr. 8 purchase The Giver by Lois Lowry

Science

- One 3-subject notebook
- One folder

Social Studies

- 1 ½ inch or larger binder with 3 tab dividers and college ruled loose leaf paper
- One folder
- Portable three ring hole punch (Dollar Tree and Amazon)
- 7th and 8th Grade Only: Pocket size of the “U.S. Constitution and The Declaration of Independence” by the Delegates of the Constitutional Convention (red and blue pocket-sized book that includes the Constitution, Bill of Rights, Amendments, and Declaration of Independence - \$1.99 on Amazon)

Technology Fee: All students in grades 1-8 will be given a ChromeBook or laptop to use while they are a student at St. Thomas the Apostle. These students will need to submit a \$50 Technology Fee to cover the cost of maintenance of the device, minor

repairs, lost power cords, etc. before their device is issued. This fee is payable by cash or check made out to St. Thomas the Apostle School.

Grade 6 & 7 Class Fee: \$25.00 - due September 9, 2020. This fee is for special occasions, seasonal parties, and the Diocesan Home School Association Dues and Assessments. Please send cash in an envelope with your child's name on it. If you choose to pay by check, please make the check payable to **St. Thomas the Apostle School**, however cash is preferred.

Grade 8 Class Fee: Due to the extra activities that Grade 8 participates in, such as Ring Day, retreats and trips, Baccalaureate Mass, and Graduation, to name a few, the class fee will be assessed in two payments; one in the fall and one in the spring. Please send the first payment of \$150.00 to your child's homeroom teacher by Friday, September 11, 2020.
